
Naming the community education room

The community education room is our most visible space, used for art-making, classes, public lectures, student activities, celebrations, dance, public rentals and so much more. As the dynamic heart of our museum, this vast multi-use space serves the UC Davis community and other visitors

from morning to night. With its entrance located just inside the museum's main doors, the 125-person venue changes the way the museum is perceived and experienced by all. We look forward to reopening this centerpiece of our museum as soon as it is safe to do so—and, after being so limited in their activities, we anticipate that future

visitors will value opportunities for in-person engagement more than ever.


Once our physical museum reopens, the community education room will return to being used for non-arts activities 80% of the time, including for classes ranging from industrial engineering and animal husbandry to math and English literature. For so many students, these classes become introductions not just to course material but to museums themselves. Those who first get to know the museum through a class, reception or event in the community education room frequently take the next steps of exploring our galleries, speaking with staff, connecting with artists or learning about their own capacity for creative exploration.

We consider this the community education room's greatest impact: By lowering the barriers to entry for a wide variety of audiences, we are changing how an entire generation

engages with the world of museums and art.

The significance of this access is amplified when considering that nearly half of incoming UC Davis undergraduates are the first generation in their families to attend college. Naming the community education room would celebrate these students' successes as well as the life-changing introduction to the world of art museums that the space provides.

Aligning your family name with the museum's most prominent space would represent a key endorsement of the important activities housed there. In addition, your gift would help our museum achieve a significant financial milestone, allowing us to retire our current debt to the university chancellor.



Investing in our endowment

Supporting the museum's endowment, which generates a reliable source of income in perpetuity, is a critical way to ensure that our programs continue to thrive and serve the community over the long term.

Your \$/n harmon gift to endow a high-priority program will provide dedicated financial resources for the Manetti Shrem Museum to transform our students' connections to art, promote emerging artists, push creative boundaries, and impact the broader community with a wide variety of events and resources. The Art Acquisition Fund

Hundreds of pieces of art have been donated to the museum since we opened in November 2016, and we have relied entirely on the goodwill and generosity of the community to build our collection. Having dedicated funds available for acquisition would allow us to purchase masterpieces when rare opportunities present themselves. A gift to name the Art Acquisition Fund would help us achieve our goal of becoming the primary repository of works by UC Davis' first-generation art faculty—trailblazers in forward-thinking styles like California Funk, which was born on our campus.

As the largest generational transfer of art in U.S. history takes place, those who seek a home for their collections will look to us. A gift to name the Art Acquisition Fund will prepare us to acquire defining pieces that will put our museum on the map—and the wall name will be recognized as the family who made it possible.

The Artist Discovery Fund

Fresh perspectives inspire fresh ideas and new conversations about art. Without access to exhibition and promotion opportunities, however, many artists especially those from backgrounds underrepresented in the art world—may never reach the audiences who are most eager to view their work. The Artist Discovery Fund will support new or emerging creative voices and facilitate solo exhibitions for promising artists. These artists will enjoy a residency and a museum exhibition experience, whether in-person or online, that will highlight their work and connect them with audiences throughout the region.

A gift to name this fund would position our museum as a leader in celebrating progressive art and amplifying diverse voices—associating your family's legacy with innovation and equality in fine art for generations to come.

The Art Studio Fund

The Manetti Shrem is the first university museum in the nation to have a wet art studio, and we continue to explore the possibilities for how we can maximize the use of this unique asset. We have held free, open art-making activities in this space that complement the exhibitions shown in the galleries, hired UC Davis MFA students to plan activities, and held mini-classes in studio art here such as "Sketching the Human Form." There remains a vast diversity of art education that could be hosted in this state-of-the-art space to benefit families, professional artists and students of all ages.

A gift to name the Art Studio Fund would allow us to continue to push the boundaries of the traditional museum experience by inviting all of our audiences to explore their inner artists through an undeniably rare public resource.

A campaign gift toward our endowment would be doubly timely thanks to a recent pledge made by our founding donors Jan Shrem and Maria Manetti Shrem. Mr. Shrem and Mrs. Manetti Shrem have offered to match the first \$3 million raised toward our endowment—a target we intend to exceed.

We respect that, for each donor who wishes to provide significant philanthropic support, there are personal, financial and gift planning aspects to consider. We will work with you to realize your philanthropic vision and develop the gift plan that best meets your needs. At your request, we can also work with your tax and financial advisors.

Following are various gift types and their associated benefits. You may wish to consider a mix of gift types to help you achieve both your philanthropic and financial objectives.

Cash Gifts

- Are the simplest and most popular giving method
- Can be tax deductible in the year they are given

Gifts of Securities

- Include stocks, mutual funds and bonds
- Can avoid capital gains taxes
- Can provide an income tax deduction for the full fair market value of long-term, appreciated securities

Gifts of Real Property

- Include land, farms, personal residences, and rental or commercial property
- Can avoid capital gains tax on appreciated assets
- Can provide an income tax deduction for the full fair market value of long-term, appreciated property
- Can eliminate property expenses and taxes
- Can provide continued use for life through a retained life estate gift

Bequests and Living Trusts

- Establish the UC Davis Foundation as a beneficiary of your estate
- Can provide an estate tax deduction equal to the value of the gift
- Offer flexibility by allowing you to provide for family first

Retirement Plan Gifts

- For current gifts, utilize the IRA Charitable Rollover provision (for donors aged 70½ and older)
- Name the UC Davis Foundation as a beneficiary
- Can eliminate income tax on the plan distributions
- Preserve the plan's full value for gift purposes

Life Income Gifts

- Include charitable remainder trusts and gift annuities
- Can provide potential tax savings on income, estate and capital gains
- Generate income for you and/or your loved ones for a fixed period of time or until your passing
- Distribute the remaining assets to the UC Davis Foundation
