Handshake also allows you to see where self-identified alumni from UC Davis are working.

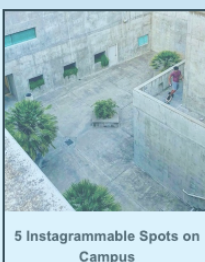
Addressing Mental Health Needs

Rigorous academics, balancing coursework, research, jobs or internships, forming new relationships. As you well know, these are a few of the challenges that create stress in the lives of university students. For a growing number of students, the stress may impact mental health, making it difficult to manage the daily demands of school. As many as one in five students experiences a mental health condition while in college.

Recognizing that student mental health is an ongoing and urgent issue for higher education, UC Davis Chancellor Cary May last year convened the Mental Health Care Task Force. The new director of Counseling Services, Dr. Paul Kim, prioritized the following initiatives in response to recommendations from the task force:

- The Counseling Services mission statement was updated with input from all Counseling Services staff.
- Counselor time is now set aside to provide availability for crisis services in North Hall, identified as the preferred hub for services.
- Online scheduling for counseling appointments began in December 2018.
- Six counselor positions were successfully recruited this academic year, and two more positions will be filled before the year ends.
- The University of California Office of the President Mental Health Initiative originally earmarked funding for 11 counselors at UC Davis by 2021 and will be supporting all 11 counselors by spring 2019.
- Support for new opportunities to collaborate within Student Health and Counseling Services, such as the expansion of the Mental Health Map on [Each Aggie Matters](#)

To enhance and strengthen the relationship between Counseling Services and the student body, Dr. Kim will be engaging with the [Mental Health Coalition](#) and its member student groups, as well as a number of committees including, but not limited to, the [Basic Needs Oversight Committee](#), Student Affairs Leadership Team and the UC Office of the President Privacy Workgroup. The department has been tasked to explore new avenues for outreach and care, and convene a UC Davis Mental Health Committee.

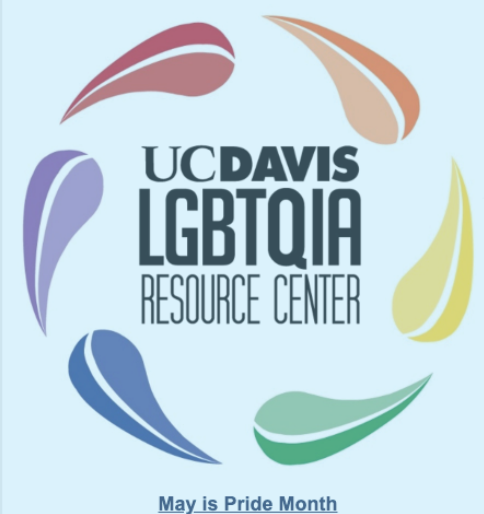

A bonus: no need to dust off those dress shoes. Find out about the Internship and Career Center's other virtual services [on their website](#).

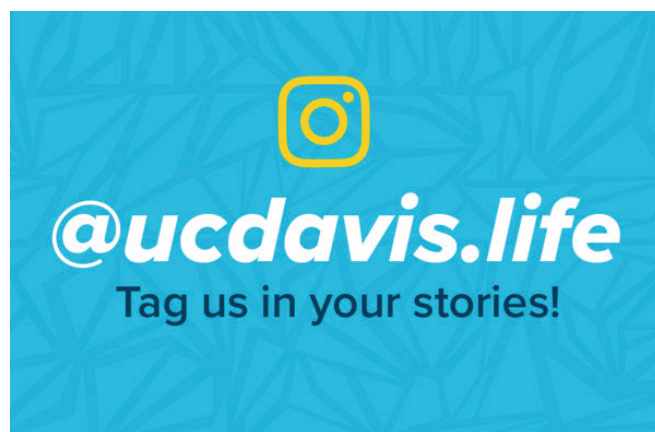


Pride Month 2020: Nourishing Stories, Online
